Solomon brings to mind wealth and wisdom. Wesley was founder of the Methodist church. Say "Henry Ford" and we automatically think of the automobile industry.

## CHURCH CALLS NEW PASTOR

On August 26, the church met in council at 10:30 A.M., between worship services. After hearing from the Pastor Search committee, the members present voted to call Dan Scalf to serve as the senior pastor of the Bradford Church of the Brethren, and to call John Shelton to serve as part-time associate pastor.

The council meeting was opened with prayer by Deacon Gary Godfrey. He then introduced Dennis Baker, who gave a report for the Pastor Search Committee. He said that the committee unanimously felt that the Lord was affirming that the proposed pastor team was His will for the congregation. Based on that belief, the committee recommended that the call be issued to these two men.

A brief biography was given for Dan Scalf, covering his family, education and experience in ministry. John Shelton was commended for the service he has given to the congregation as interim pastor.

The meeting was opened to questions from the congregation. In response to an inquiry, John Shelton re-

sponded that he supported this proposal. He stated that he has already been in contact with Dan, and feels that they will be able to work well together to continue the work of the church.

Dennis Baker made a motion that Dan Scalf be called as senior pastor, and John Shelton as part-time associate pastor. Gary Godfrey seconded the motion. Ballots were passed out to members of the church, who were instructed to write "yes" if in favor of the motion, "no" if they were against it. The ballots were collected and counted. The final tally was 76 votes in favor of calling these two men to the proposed positions, with 3 votes against.

Dan Scalf will assume his duties with the church on October 1. His first Sunday in the pulpit will be October 7.

Dan, his wife Becca, son Shepherd (3) and daughter September (1) are preparing to move to Bradford from their current home in Petersburg, Kentucky.

In Petersburg Dan has served as youth pastor for the Bullittsburg Baptist Church.

Before his service there he was a team leader with Mountain Outreach in Williamsburg, KY, and youth pastor at First Baptist Church here in Bradford.

A Bradford native, Dan has studied religion, bible, ministry and youth ministry at Cumberland College and Clear Creek Baptist Bible College. He has had continuing education in youth ministry and publishing.

He has experience in organizing and implementing church programs; speaking and teaching; bible studies; organizing worship services; counseling; technology use; and areas of pastoral care such as funerals, weddings, and visitation.

John Shelton is well known in the church and community for showing the love of Christ through pastoral care for those in and outside of the church.

Be in prayer for these men and their families as they seek to serve the Lord and his people in this community. And pray that the Lord will move his people to join in the work of ministry.

And tries his best to kill us!

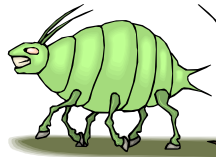
There's not much you and I can do

# Easy Applesauce Muffins

*This healthy recipe will make a great start to your day, a great snack or a great gift for your teacher and classmates.*

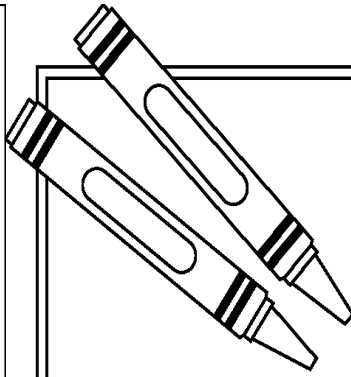
## What you need:

- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- ⅔ cup brown sugar
- 1½ cups chunky applesauce
- Baking cups



## What you do:

1. With an adult's help, heat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a 12-cup muffin tin with baking cups and set aside.
2. In a small, microwave-safe bowl, melt the butter on high for about 30 seconds; set aside to cool slightly.
3. Sift together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon and salt in to a large mixing bowl.
4. In another large bowl, whisk together the eggs and brown sugar. Stir in the applesauce and melted butter until the mixture is smooth.
5. Pour the apple mixture over the flour mixture. Stir with a wooden spoon just until the flour disappears. (This will produce muffins with a nice, crumbly texture.)
6. Fill the baking cups about two-thirds full with batter. (For mess-free muffins, use an ice-cream scoop to spoon batter into the baking cups.)
7. Bake for 20 minutes or until light brown. Test for doneness by inserting a toothpick in the middle; if it comes out clean, the muffins are ready to eat. Makes 12.

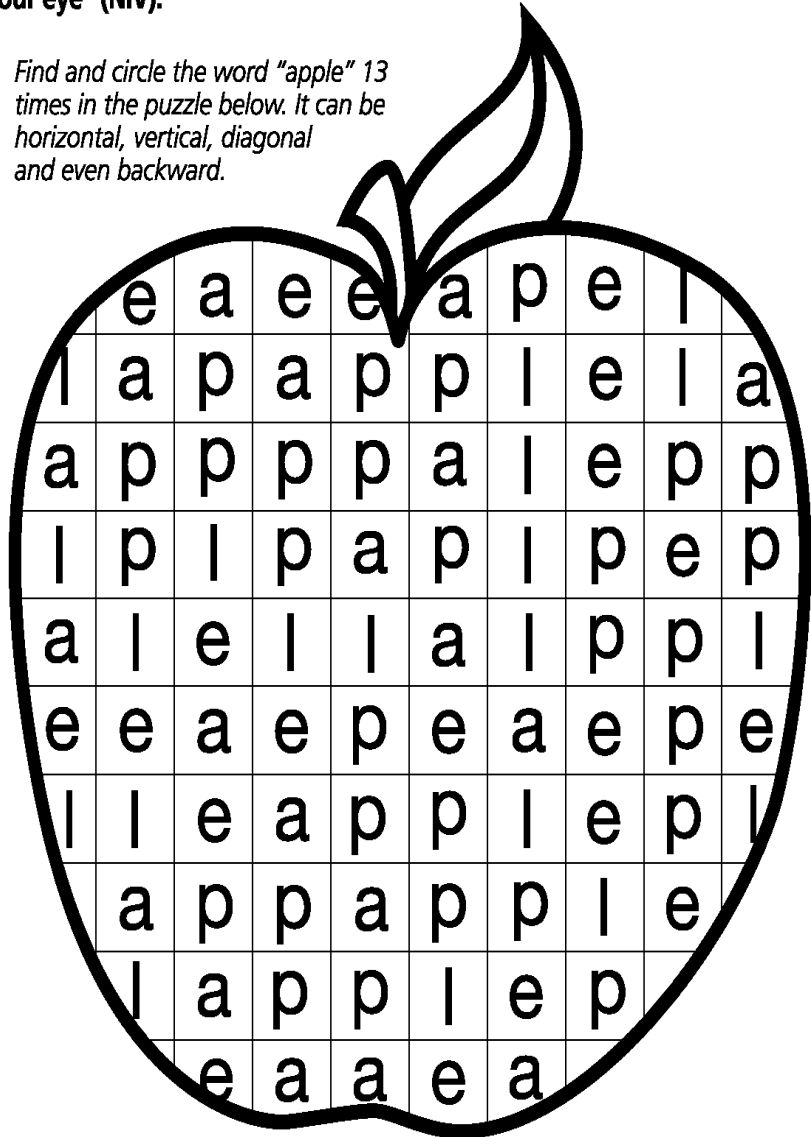
